
Discover the views that John Constable painted in the hamlet of Flatford, set within the Dedham Vale countryside, during a visit to Flatford Mill.





# Nice bike mate! - 4 Mates Ride to Romania - by Pete Berry.

Jeff said to me "How about Romania?" – "ok" I said. He planned a route based on an organised tour that had been cancelled twice by Covid and he was very keen to complete his mission. It was 21 days long! "Crikey can we do it in 18" I said. We 'booking.com'd' two twin rooms in hope of getting more company.

Planned highlights were: The Eagle's nest, Corvin's castle, The Transfagarasan (Clarkson's BRITW), Bran (Dracula's) Castle, the Transalpina and finally Budapest. Well, five out of six wasn't bad, as the Eagle's nest was 'a bridge too far' Total mileage was estimated at 3402, with 3 'rest days' and in the end that was accurate.



It wasn't a hard sell to recruit Paul, who did great scenic tweaks to the original route (he loves it and is great) and finally Frank, our most qualified 1st aider. I did the accounts, daily diary, videos and recruitment. Three GS's and the remarkable outlier, the '98 VFR800 met up and stayed at Debbie's Digs in Ashford, ready for an 07:20 Eurotunnel and an uneventful 320 mile slog to Saarbrucken.

Soon we were in the Black Forest and enjoying the brilliant, and recently resurfaced, northern section of the B500. Big smiles, as now it felt like we were touring.

Our arrival in Zell am Zee was stressful, as, very hot, tired and needing beer, we discovered they had doubled booked our pre-paid apartment, grrr. Alternate accommodation quickly found and we were unpacked and in the bar by 7:15.

Next day, to Vezprem, Hungary was a day to forget as it was torrential rain all day. We still laughed as Jeff lowered both sleeves producing simultaneous waterfalls. The day wasn't helped because the countryside was so flat and the roads so straight and long. We yelped with joy when joining a motorway slip road because it had a decent curve © Then, after crossing the border into Romania (V5's were thoroughly checked) and on to Timisora. After dinner, in an unlit street, Jeff fell and sprained his ankle badly in a pavement pothole. We were all very thankful that he didn't break it.

Two nights to rest and explore the Medieval city of Sibiu, made even better by our 4\* hotel with spa facilities right in the centre. Normally, I'd ride on a rest day, but on this trip, rest days were all well-deserved and needed.

The Transfagarasan was worth seeing, as the views were great, but due to the current state of the road surface, we were all left disappointed with the ride. Apart from the views, the highlight was meeting a Brown Bear which we would have met head on round a tight bend, had we been minutes later.

Whilst in Transylvania, we fitted in a whirlwind tour of Bran castle, worth seeing while we were there. It was raining hard, but we utilised dirt cheap Ubers to and from our hotel. The Transalpina was the best road we experienced on our trip. Great surface, curves, a technical road and it just kept going. We often swapped the lead for concentration purposes. In fact, we all said it was one of the best roads we have ever ridden... and we have all ridden the Alps, Dolomites and the N222 in the Douro Valley.

For half an hour though, as we approached the top of the Transaplina (2145m) and descended, temperatures dropped, as expected, but noone expected -1°C! Coupled with freezing fog veiling the potential wonderful views and reducing visibility to 15m. To top it all, sidewinds so strong, doing about 15mph I could just make out Jeff ahead of me leaning at 30° into it. Well, they do close it at the end of September. Thankfully, we came across a cozy Alpine refuge, which we likened to a Himalayan basecamp.



They served hot Mutton and Polenta, hot coffee and had a shelter so we could thaw out.

The driving standards that we witnessed in Romania were 'interesting and unpredictable' shall we say, as we all experienced some close shaves. E.g. the car speeding up and round a blind hairpin halfway over the centre line was inches away from Frank's LH pannier. And in Germany, there was the guy casually walking across our four-lane autobahn, bag slung over his back, to get from Frankfurt Airport to the Hilton Hotel. Unbelievable Jeff!  $\bigcirc$ 

Accommodation ranged from two to four star and averaged £40 each per night, so, all in, including petrol, food, spending, total costs were a bargainous £1650 for 19 days. 95% of establishments in Romania accepted credit cards, luckily, as we only had Euros which they did take, but at an unfavourable rate. Three of us were linked up with Cardo comms that turned out to be useful for satnay comparisons and immensely timesaving.





Memories include: Oradea by night (photo), Biking the Transalpina, the brown bear on the Transfagarasan, wild dogs chasing us, Romany horse and carts, animals on roads, unmanned level crossings with overgrown tracks, primitive drainpipes in villages, the diverse housing landscape, more insect bites than normal. great value drink & food such as the traditional Papanasi sweet treat, friendly people, Turkish baths in Budapest, the flooded Danube, the views. long but worthwhile days and recollections and laughs over beer and a meal.

In summary, simply, if you get a chance, I'd say "go". Do take some 'Leu' cash for coffees. However, to enjoy Romania, you don't have to ride all the way, consider flying and hiring, I'm sure it would be cheaper and quicker, but we had great experiences on the way and an absolutely epic tour.
