HBAM Challenge 2024

The HBAM Challenge registration is going live from today. The registration link takes you to Ticket Tailor and is simply a way to log participants and build the spreadsheet for recording your adventures and more importantly your points!!!

Once you have registered on Ticket Tailor, the locations map, location details and general challenge guidelines will be sent to you.

The challenge will run from March until the end of September 2024, but you can register at any time.

Essentially it involves riding to pre-defined locations around the UK, taking a selfie to prove the visit and returning the picture and the visit date to the 'Challenge' email address noted in the guidelines. Locations are varied, with some relatively local to our general area, whilst some are further afield for the more adventurous!

You may even find some of the locations are on the club rides, or tours, so keep a look out on the rideouts box office. The rides can be done as part of a group, or solo, so it's entirely up to you how you want to collect the points!

Each location visited helps build up a points tally, with the Challenge Trophy being presented during the end of season club night, to the rider with the most points!

As a slight twist, some locations include a 'Local Celebrity', or 'Bonus', which if found and included in the selfie picture, attract bonus points.

There are 'Celebrities' lined up in Scotland and Devon already. HBAM Member, Paul Lake in Scotland, Grant Hallworth in Devon and my mate Graham Storer, also in Devon, are ready to be tracked down to gain extra points!

There is a locations map included on the next page, but please remember the points won't be counted if you haven't registered on Ticket Tailor.

Please also remember that there is no obligation to visit any of the locations and that you remain responsible for your own safety and for complying with the law on all rides.

Nice bike mate! - Bernie Mcfarlane's VFR800x

Not a project as such, but more about the life and changes of my 2011 VFR800x Crossrunner VTEC

It's now almost 13-years old and travelled the UK and Europe the mileage is the equivalent of 4 time around the world.

I brought this from Honda in Letchworth in 2011. It was not on my shopping list, but I ended up playing and pushing the sales guy to see how low I could get him or what deal I could get. The bike had 3000 demo miles, so I used this too as a negotiation tool. I had a good friend who was the chief Negotiator of a large company give me 30 mins of time to teach me how negotiate and pitch when buying.

His technique has always worked.

- •a good price
- •free panniers and top box
- extended warranty
- •new tyres.

thus far its amassed 101793 miles!



The reason that I was drawn to the bike in the first place was the simplicity of the electronics, like my previous two bikes there is little to go wrong (fingers, toes, arms and legs crossed, as I wrote this)

Honda Blackbird had no gizmo's not even ABS. Then my GS1150 (heated grips and ABS) and very agricultural.

During its time it's started to show its age, so just like a human, it needs a bit of help with the cosmetics, face lifts, aching joints etc.





So, over the past few years it's had the following (I would have got peanuts and spent a fortune in the Sell/sale world of used bikes.

Apart from the obvious maintenance requirements it's had:

- •New uprated Rear Shock (should have been done much earlier a great change to the ride).
- Wheels powder coated (much better than the Honda finish)
- •Top Box and panniers started to look damaged and tatty so I had them wrapped in silver to match the wheels.
- •Regular change of oil and filter (twice a year)
- •Chain lubes every ride (It's not a BMW in case you're not familiar with the term)

I have another bike in the shed, but I'll have to tell you about that in another issue.
